ORDER (Date of Hearing 22.03.2022)

1. The Petitioner, GIL has filed this petition seeking approval of the Tripartite Supplementary Power Purchase Agreement Dated 03.02.2021 entered into between the Petitioners for Standby Emergency Assistance Supply of power. UPPCL and PUVVNL have agreed to provide Emergency Power up to 10 MW to M/s Grasim Industries Limited w.e.f. signing of the agreement subject to the availability of power and taking into account







technical and commercial feasibility on the terms and conditions specified in the agreement.

- 2. The prayer of the Petitioner is as below:
 - a) The Commission may kindly be pleased to approve this Standby Emergency Assistance Supply Agreement and also pass such other orders as it may deem necessary.

Records of Proceedings:

- 3. During the hearing, Sh. Ajai Vikram Singh stated that this petition has been filed seeking approval of the Emergency Assistant Supply Agreement executed on 03.02.2021.
- 4. The Commission asked the parties, whether there is any dispute among the parties or any deviation to the provision of UPERC (CRE) Regulations, 2019, to which the parties have responded that neither there is dispute between the parties nor any deviation to the provision of UPERC (CRE) Regulations.

Commission's view:

5. The Commission observed that this being a commercial agreement between the parties and there is no need of seeking separate approval of the Agreement unless there is a dispute between parties or deviation with respect to applicable Regulation.

In view of the above, the Commission takes the Agreement on record and disposes the matter with liberty to approach the Commission for any dispute in future.
